The 2020-2021 school year begins in less than two weeks with orientation on August 24 and 25, and classes starting on Wednesday, August 26. Due to COVID, we have made all courses available online; however, on campus courses are also safely available with some modifications. The following explains the changes we have made for the Fall 2020 semester:

On Campus:

Students who choose will receive instruction on campus for all courses as scheduled. Course instruction will be delivered in three methods depending on the instructor:

1. In person at the scheduled class time on campus.
2. Zoom live interaction with the instructor at the scheduled class time on campus and/or
3. Watching a recording of the instructor on campus at the scheduled class time.

If you choose to come on campus for classes, G4HCC will follow all health and safety precautions per the local and state health departments. The safety of staff and students comes first! If you are entering the building, the following will occur:

- Your temperature will be taken,
- You will be required to wear a mask,
- You will be asked to complete and sign a checklist of symptoms that you may experience,
- You will maintain social distancing as much as possible,
- Use hand sanitizer and wash your hands frequently, and
- Leaving the building is preferred however between classes, but if you stay you will need to follow social distancing and cleaning protocols.
- Anyone refusing to comply will be denied entry.

Online:

Students will receive instruction online for all courses during the Fall 2020 semester. Course instruction will be provided online with interaction and assignments available on Populi. Individual classes will have varying deadlines. However, students may choose to watch the recordings on their own schedule. Online courses may be administered three ways:

1. a recording of live instruction in the class
 2. a Zoom recording of a previous held class and/or
 3. a recording of an instructor outside the class
- All classes will be recorded and uploaded to the G4H YouTube channel as soon as possible for your 24/7 access.
 - The syllabus for each class will be available on the class page on Populi and assignments will have specific due dates.

I must caution you – online courses are more challenging because they take greater self-discipline on the part of the student.

None of us likes this. We all have involuntarily entered a new and hugely different world. Things may never fully go back to the way they were. We are fighting a deadly and invisible new disease. If we stick together, we can succeed.
